Dear Peacham School Families.

We were happy to have a full five day week of school this week! Students were very flexible and understanding about our postponed Burke Day and have enjoyed our temporary playground area in the parking lot to avoid ice. Speaking of ice, our skating rink opened this week and students are beginning to try it out thanks to the hard work of Eric Kaufman, thank you Eric! We have lots of ice skates here at school for students to use on the rink; however, if your child has their own skates they are welcome to bring them to school and keep them in their lockers.

Flu Prevention

As many of you know, the flu is impacting New England significantly this year. Our staff has been learning about flu prevention in their classrooms and we have been educating students about ways to prevent the spread of germs. We are reminding students to wash their hands frequently, avoid sharing food, and to cover their mouths when they sneeze or cough. Additionally, for the time being, we have created a "**no slime rule**." Many students have been making/bringing in slime, playdough, and putty to use as fidgets or focus tools. Due to the nature of these substances touching hands and surfaces, we have asked students to leave their "slime" at home for the next couple of months.

LEAP

A few questions have come up recently about our LEAP program. As part of our required MTSS (Multi-Tiered Systems of Support) system, we have 45 minutes in our schedule everyday where students K-6 participate in a LEAP group. LEAP stands for Learn-Explore-Assess-Progress. Our staff meets every other week as a data team to review student data and progress that allows us to assess the needs of each student. Based on our review of data, students are placed in LEAP
